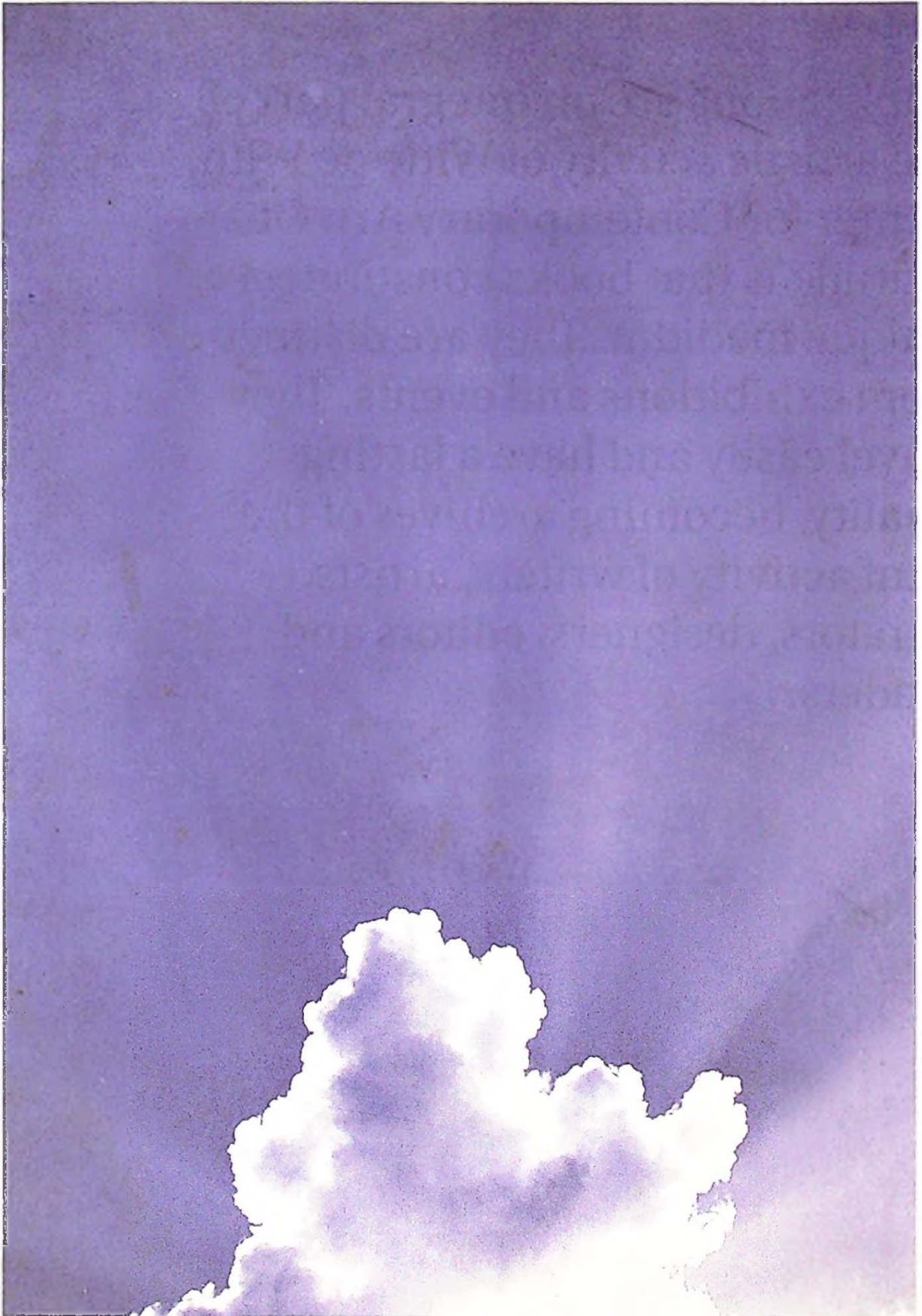




Introduction

Publications are an integral part of the artistic activity of Witte de With, Center for Contemporary Art. Our attitude is that books constitute a unique medium. They are distinct from exhibitions and events. They travel easily and have a lasting quality, becoming archives of the joint activity of writers, artists, curators, designers, editors and readers.

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Rotterdam

While Witte de With is often touted as Rotterdam's most internationally-oriented institution, we have a sense that it is impossible to understand what this means without looking more closely at the city that hosts us. Rotterdam itself is often called the most ethnically diverse city in The Netherlands, and one of the most diverse in Europe. But how can this condition be perceived and, further still, articulated? The following books, each showcasing the vision of one photographer, bring into focus very different urban protagonists.

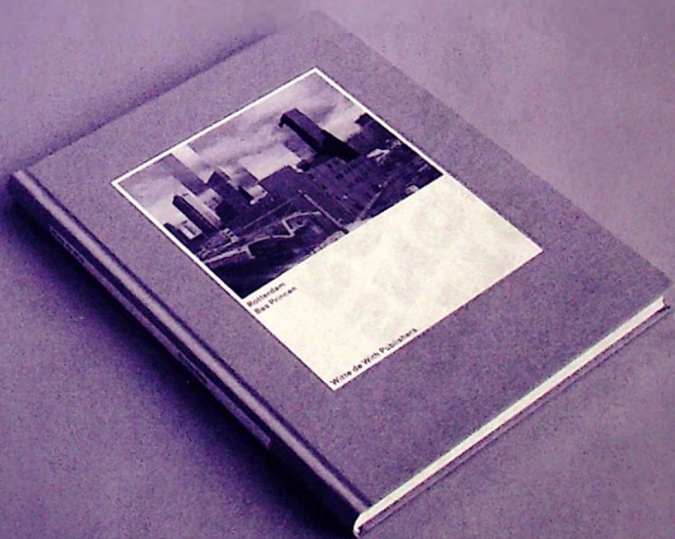


Rotterdam / Bas Princen

Rotterdam arose out of a unique commission that Witte de With extended to Bas Princen (b.1975): to develop a photographic concept for the invitations and brochures that would be published in the 2006 - 2007 season. As Princen's underlying ambition was to redefine the notion of the "non-place," his photo series challenges the audience to view the bustling city from a new angle, through its peripheral areas and border zones, places and locations that - though they form part of our daily surroundings - have no place in the city's collective memory.

On invitation from Princen, Ghent-based writer Christophe Van Gerrewey created a narrative, entitled "Peripheral Pilgrimages," acting in parallel to the forty-four photographs. Almost without people, both story and images bring the "backdrop" of the built world to the foreground.

Rotterdam / Otto Snoek

Rotterdam-born and -bred photographer Otto Snoek (b. 1966) has been documenting his city and its inhabitants for over two decades. His photographs are saturated with color and teeming with people, putting the camera in the midst of the 174 nationalities that make up the city. For Witte de With, Snoek made a new series of photos, adding other recent unpublished work from

his long-term photo essay "Hometown" (1997-). Two writers, both closely associated with Rotterdam, were asked to respond in written form. They are Rachida Azough (b. 1975, Rotterdam) and Tina Rahimy (b. 1975, Rezayeh, Iran). They produced texts and a psychoanalytic map of some of the city's social diversity.

Reflections

At stake in this series are words that define contemporary culture, but that have been used to the point of meaninglessness. The title *Reflections* calls up a particular intensity of thought and each book in this series is an invitation to one writer, who exhibits particular originality of thought, to consider one such problematic term, chosen by the editors. The book-length essay is something we rarely see in print and rarer still is its rigorous translation. These compact books make room for the original text and two translations, appearing in English and Dutch as well as a third language.

On (Surplus) Value in Art / Diedrich Diederichsen

Just what is surplus value, *Mehrwert* or *Meerwaarde* when we talk about art and culture? Changing material conditions, market dynamics and cultural ideals are reshaping how this question may be answered today. Drawing on fresh readings of Marxist and post-modern thought, renowned German cultural

critic Diedrich Diederichsen compares the abstract and climbing values of artworks with the plunging value of music – a traditionally immaterial art – in order to formulate a broad reflection on the current “crisis of valuation in the arts.”

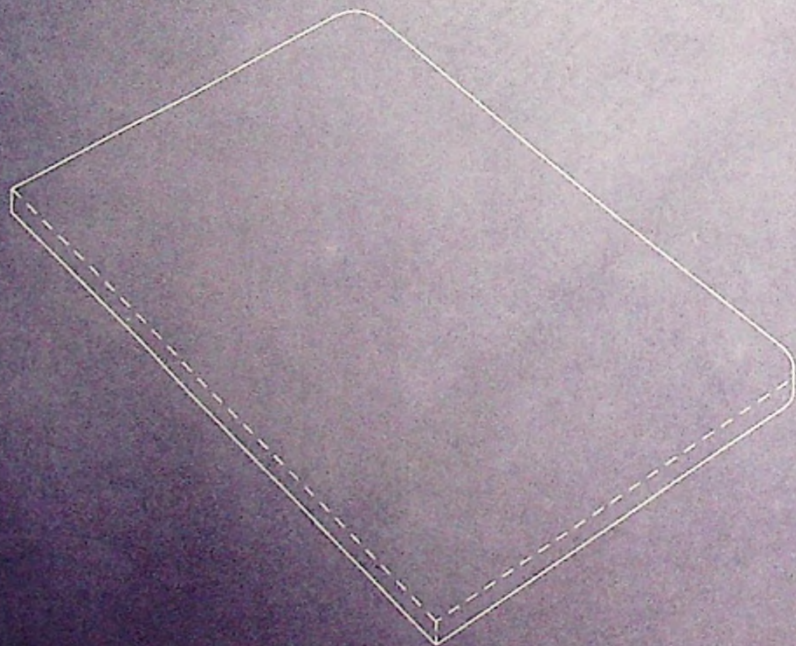

Forthcoming... Tariq Ramadan reflects on super-diversity

One of the greatest challenges for art and culture, sounded by intellectuals and also by funding bodies, is to represent diversity. But what precisely does this term mean and why does it so often placate rather than produce what it names? Prof. Steven Vertovec, Director of the Max-Planck-Institute for the Study of Religious and Ethnic Diversity (Göttingen, Germany) puts forward the notion of "super-diversity," noting "the need to re-evaluate conceptions and policy measures surrounding diversity by way of moving beyond an ethno-focal understanding and adopting a multi-dimensional approach."

Developing this idea further, while aiming to question and complicate the focus on immigration in the current

debate, we have invited the prolific and provocative scholar and activist Tariq Ramadan, to think with us about the subject. Prof. Ramadan has a unique history of engagement in Rotterdam, as Chair of Citizenship and Identity at Erasmus University and as a special advisor on integration to the city council, until his recent and highly controversial dismissal. Among his numerous academic and advisory roles, he is also Professor of Contemporary Islamic Studies at Oxford University and President of the European Muslim Network, a think-tank in Brussels. Recent publications include *Islam, the West and the Challenges of Modernity* (2009) and *Radical Reform: Islamic Ethics and Liberation* (2008).



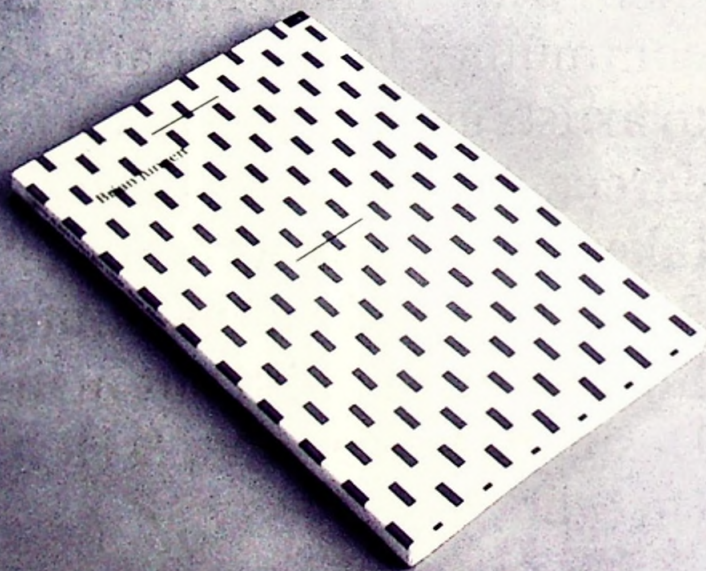
Source Books

Source Books are critical and poetic tools for accessing artists' work. In commissioning and selecting texts, the aim is to offer readers new contexts for contemporary practice. In this sense, our signature pocket-sized books become resources for the artists themselves, connecting them with an international critical community. While usually devoted to artists at a turning point in their career, Source Books have also taken on the subject of the city of Rotterdam and the encounter of exhibiting artists with our institution. Brian Jungen

Brian Jungen (b. 1967, Fort St. John, British Columbia, Canada) is an artist who treats his dual cultural heritage (Swiss and Dunne-za) as a resource and as a site for creativity. His work seeks to deepen the complexity of cultural identity – whether national, international, or transnational – by playing with ethnographic conventions and culturally coded commodities, undermining the clichés of contemporary globalized culture. The results are unusually beautiful objects that are located at the intersection of appropriation, transformation and translation. Setting a precedent, this first publication in the Source Book

series, functions not only as a record of Jungen's exhibition at Witte de With in the winter of 2006/2007, but also as a textbook that complements and extends the existing writing on his work. Essays on the artist by critics and curators combine the perspectives of a fellow Vancouverite (the writer Clint Burnham) with those of a critic (Edgar Schmitz) and a curator (Jessica Morgan), who are active in Europe. Expanding the discussion is a unique interview with eminent post-colonial scholar Homi K. Bhabha, conducted by two of the book's editors, Solange de Boer and Zoë Gray.

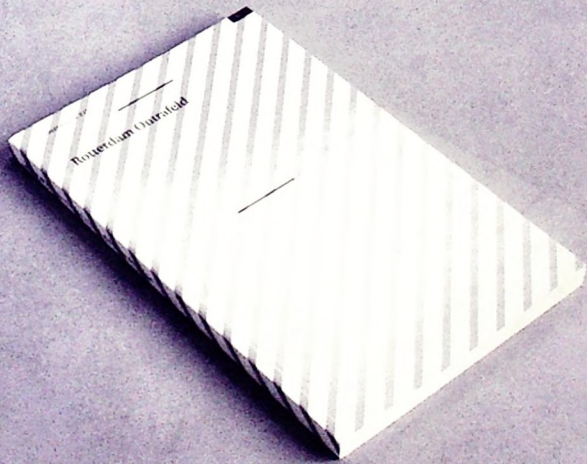

Rotterdam Ontrafeld

The Source Book uniquely takes up a city – Rotterdam – rather than the artist(s) as its point of focus. It was occasioned by *Unraveling Rotterdam, The Periphery Complex*, a series of discussions with leading figures in the Rotterdam art world, organized at Witte de With between Tuesday 27 June and Saturday 1 July 2006. During the daily

"talkshows" comprising the event, members of Witte de With's staff explored selected themes with one or two guests and with the public. The themes – ranging from questions of funding, civic policy and education to criticism, distribution of books and the ideal situations to present art – provided the basis for the essays within.

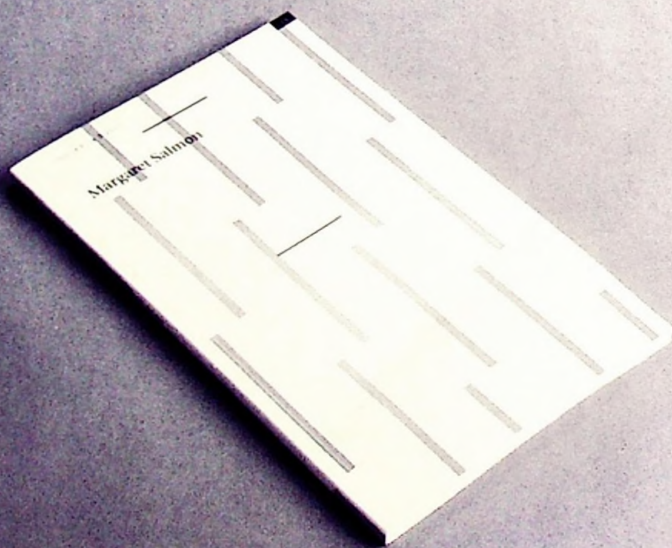

Margaret Salmon

Margaret Salmon (b. 1975, New York, USA) creates stylized portraits that weave together poetry and documentary. Focusing on individual characters in their everyday habitats, her slow-moving films capture the minutiae of daily life, infusing them with a certain grandeur. Salmon portrays the common struggle of ordinary people, constructing documents that represent characters in a social context. Her position is never aggressive nor intrusive, but balances intimacy with respectful distance, creating laconic yet moving works that are at once sober and lyrical, filled with a fragile sense of humanity.

This Source Book, published on the occasion of the exhibition *Margaret Salmon* at Witte de With in 2007, combines an interview with the artist by curator Zoë Gray, an essay on her work by Bina von Stauffenberg as well as two previously published texts, which both influence and illuminate Salmon's practice: the film critic André Bazin's seminal essay "An Aesthetic of Reality: Neorealism"; and Raymond Carver's "Everything Struck to Him," a little-known short story by a pioneer of noir fiction.

Changing Roles: Artists' personal views and wishes

How are you involved in the art world? Are you related to any specific art scene? What would be the most productive place to present your work? What kind of curators do you like to work with and why? What does the art market mean for your work? In your opinion, what are centers for contemporary art for? What would you like to see them presenting?

These are the open questions asked to every artist who participated in Witte de With's program between 2006 and 2007, which numbered over seventy individuals. The resulting publication yields frank and at times funny insights into artists' concerns and the changing potential of the art institution.

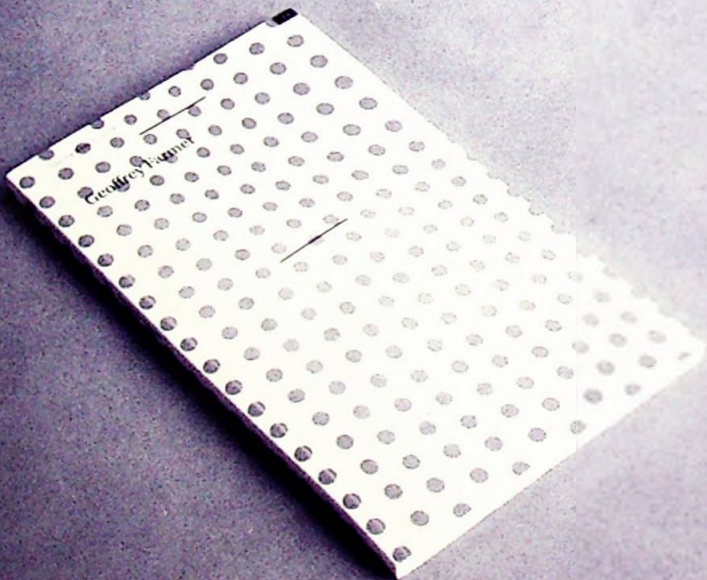

Geoffrey Farmer

The art of Geoffrey Farmer (b.1967, Vancouver, Canada) has roots in Dada, Happenings and the process- and performance-based works of John Cage, Joan Jonas and Robert Morris. It poses the possibility of alternative temporalities, reconfigures the opposition between material and concept and embarks on odysseys of performative meaning-making. In his exhibition at Witte de With in 2008, curated by Zoë Gray and Nicolaus Schafhausen, Farmer adapted an earlier installation revolving around the passenger cabin of an airplane. This Source Book offers a parallel space of reflection occasioned by and

completed during Farmer's exhibition. Three extraordinary essayists - Diedrich Diederichsen, Vanessa Desclaux and Thierry Davila - were invited to encounter the artist's mercurial practice in different contexts. They speculate on his inventive approach to temporality, to the spaces of theater, film and performance and on the way he negotiates the boundaries of meaning and art. The book is published as a companion to the exhibition. As a result, the book is not only a critical reflection on the exhibition, but also a visual and textual fragment of the exhibition, which after one month is already receding into the past. The book is available as *Forgetting All*.

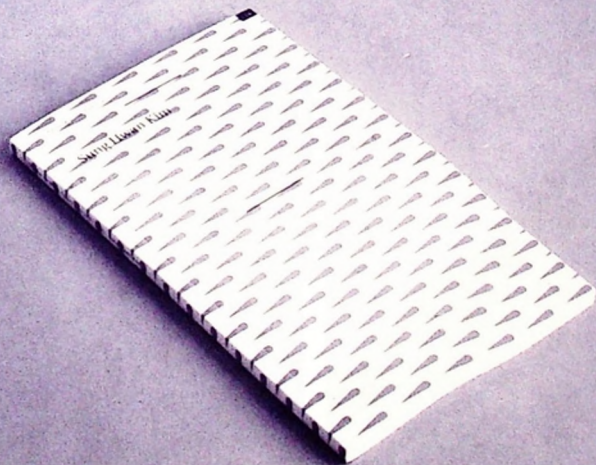

Sung Hwan Kim

This is the first monographic publication devoted to the work of Sung Hwan Kim (b. 1975, Seoul, Korea), published in conjunction with his solo exhibition at Witte de With in 2009, curated by Eva Huttenlauch and Nicolaus Schafhausen. Kim experiments with narrative formats using video and performance, as well as installation. Collecting and collaging encounters, images, sounds, and objects from his changing domiciles of Seoul, Amsterdam and New York, he portrays his world with lyric complexity. Previously a resident of The Netherlands, Kim spent two years as fellow at the Rijksakademie in 2004/2005 and in

2007, he won both the 2nd prize of the prestigious Dutch award the Prix de Rome and the Korean award Hermes Korea Missulsang (Hermes Korea Prize for Contemporary Art). The Source Book offers a multifaceted encounter with his work via the artist's own writing, a conversation with his friend and mentor Joan Jonas, an account of his Prix de Rome performance by Ann Demeester, as well as an essay on Mapuche radio in Chile by the Harvard-based professor Luis E. Cárcamo-Huechante; Eva Huttenlauch offers an introduction.

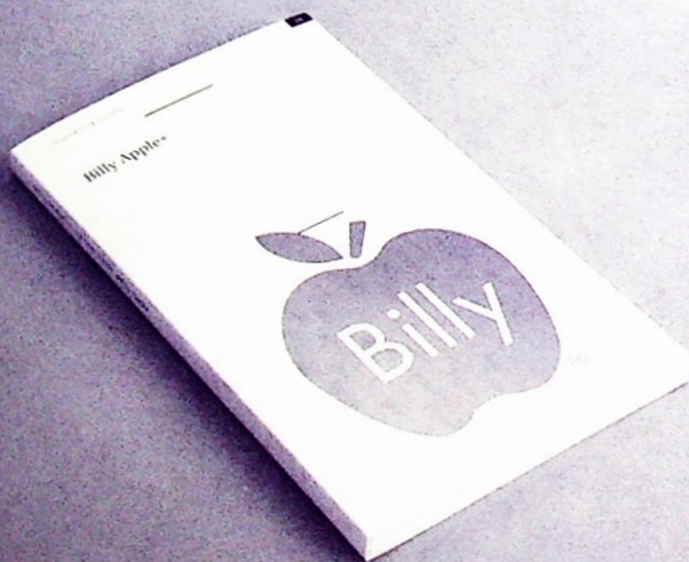

Billy Apple*

Billy Apple was created in 1962 as a work, when the New Zealand-born **Barrie Bates** changed his name and became a living brand, shortly after graduating from London's Royal College of Art. Subsequently, Billy Apple embarked upon an artistic project that has shaped his practice for five decades, as he has consistently erased the apparently arbitrary borders between his work and his life. This Source Book is published on the occasion of the two-part exhibition at Witte de With: *A History of the Brand and the Work it has created* during the Summer of 2009.

Four writers have been invited to contribute: New Zealand art historian and curator **Christina Barton** offers an insightful chronology; the French critic **Bénédicte Ramade** situates Apple's practice in the context of institutional critique; the value systems of the Billy Apple brand are discussed by **William Wood**, a Vancouver-based critic and art historian; and the expatriate New Zealand artist and scholar **Michelle Menzies** considers Apple's sense of identity and his enduring significance for younger generations.

Monographs

While they have always held a prominent place amidst Witte de With publications, monographic books that delve deeply into the work of a single artist gained prominence from the Winter of 2007/2008 through the Summer of 2009, as Witte de With committed exclusively to monographic exhibitions. They are as varied as the artists with whom we work. And beyond the close engagement with individual artists, these books often intensify our collaborations with other internationally and critically minded institutions, including art centers and publishers.

Tue Greenfort: Photosynthesis

Tue Greenfort (b. 1973) seeks out hidden corners or non-places where the boundaries between "nature" and "culture" are blurred. This small, iconic book, from a series developed by Nicolaus Schafhausen and Caroline Schneider for their publishing partnership Lukas & Sternberg, features images from *Photosynthesis*, Greenfort's exhibition at Witte de With in the Spring of 2006, a newly commissioned essay on the

artist's work by Maria Muhle, an interview between the artist and curator Zoë Gray, as well as extracts from the Danish scientist Jesper Hoffmeyer's book *Signs of Meaning in the Universe*, which has greatly influenced Greenfort's thinking about nature.

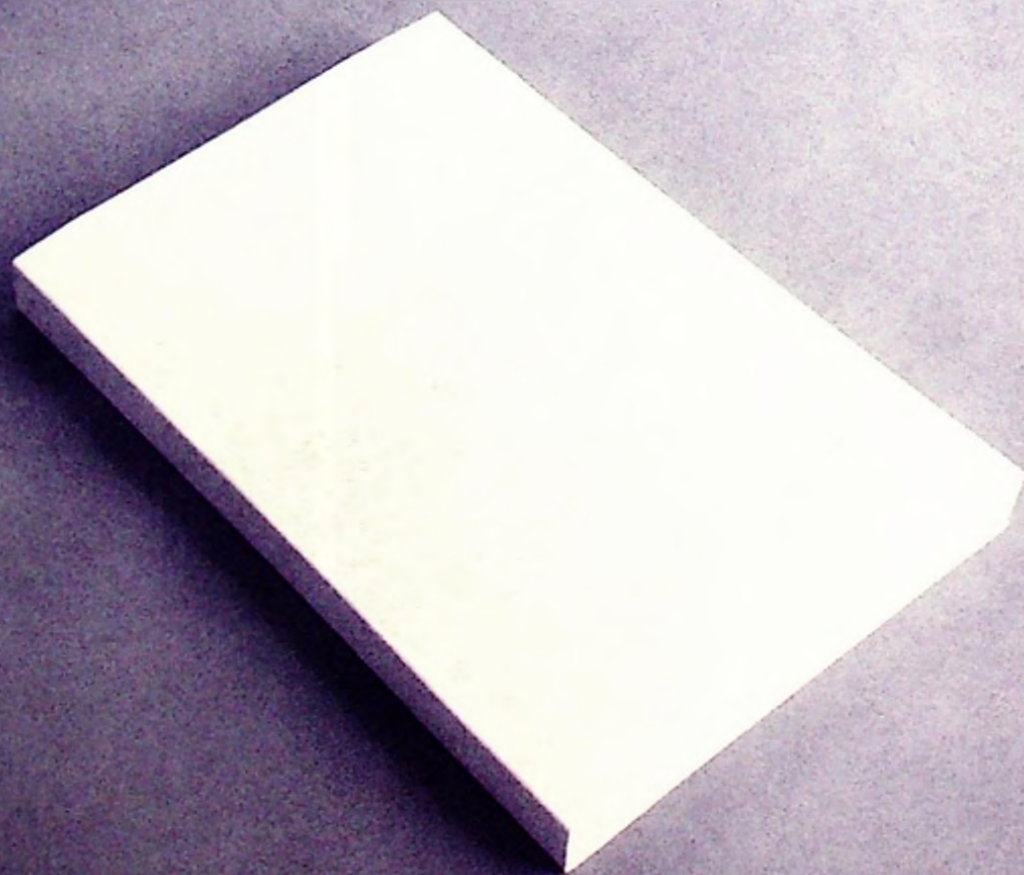
Mathias Poledna: Western Recording

Mathias Poledna (b. 1965) works with archives and a highly formalized cinematic vocabulary. In the words of Tom Holert: "Poledna's installations react to a crisis of the concept of history and the precarious status of historical 'events', they emanate from this crisis."

Designed by the artist himself, with a striking yellow cover and a sparse modern interior, this book focuses on *Western Recording*, one of two installations, which comprised Poledna's solo

exhibition at the Witte de With, jointly organized with the Museum of Modern Art Foundation Ludwig Vienna, in the Spring and Summer of 2006.

Jesper Just: Film Works 2001 - 2007

Jesper Just (b. 1974) operates at an operatic emotional register, raising questions about the social codes of male subjectivity and the competing reign of reason and of camp within contemporary aesthetics. This first extensive catalogue of the artist's film works, contains film and production stills with full film credits, an essay introducing Just and his work by Nina Folkersma, additional texts by Jacob Lillemose and Ilsa Colsell, as well as several music scores by Petri Sirviö.

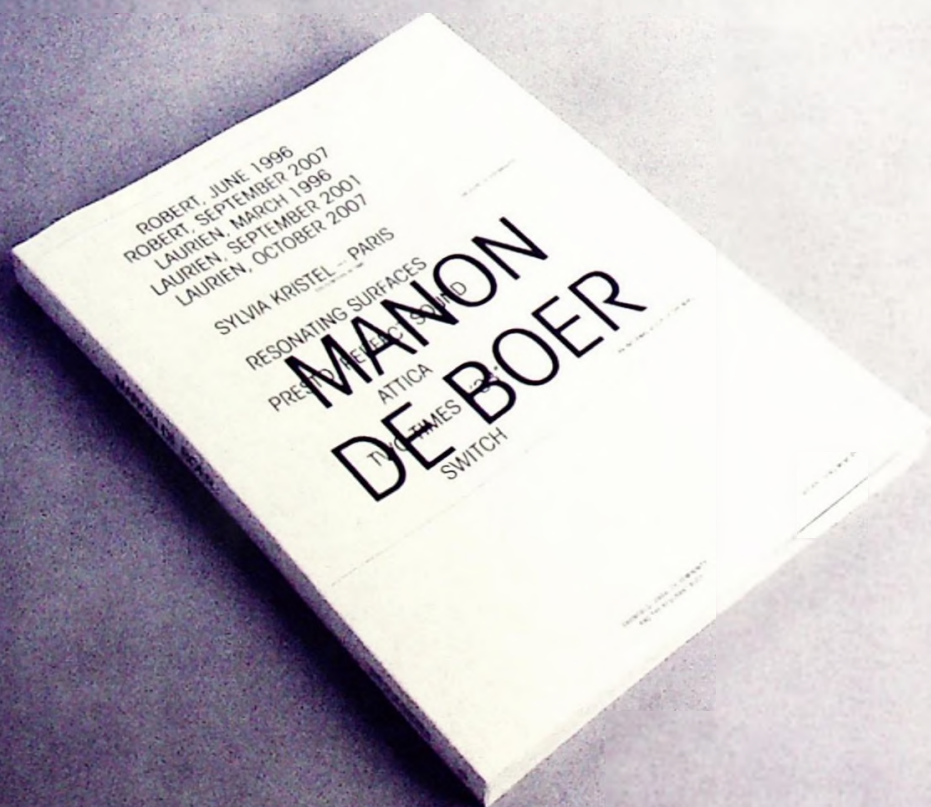
Manon de Boer

This is the first extensive catalogue of the work of Brussels-based artist Manon de Boer (b. 1966). For over a decade, de Boer has worked with film and sound media to shape a unique notion of time, of history and of subjectivity. The book contains extensive documentation of nearly all of her work, produced up to the date of publication, including an experimental translation by Paul Elliman of her sound work *Switch*. Essays by Elena Crippa, Lars Bang Larsen, Chus Martínez and Suely Rolnik, as well as Tobi Meier's annotated transcription

of a music seminar given by John Wozencroft at Goldsmiths University in London, establish key philosophical, historical and aesthetic entry points into de Boer's work.

Ian Wallace: A Literature of Images

Artist, writer and teacher, Ian Wallace (b. 1946) was key in shaping a unique artistic milieu in Vancouver, Canada that is recognized internationally for its formal and theoretical rigor. Best known for developing a pictorial idiom that unites monochrome painting and documentary photography in testing the (communitative and) ecological limits of the image, his wide-ranging practice (now in its fifth decade of development) encompasses text works, multimedia and video, as well as paintings with aerial and diagrammatical topography. Recently released, this is the most extensive catalogue of his artistic work produced to date. The essays commissioned for this book – by Vanessa Joan Müller, Dieter Roelstraete,

Jacques Rancière and Wallace himself – as well as the interview between the artist and Renske Janssen, outline the complexities of Wallace's practice with an eye to their broader implications in contemporary and historical art and literature, philosophy and culture.

Saadane Afif: Technical Specifications

Saadane Afif (b. 1970) is a Berlin-based artist who experiments with sculpture and sound, often as media of collective engagement. His survey exhibition *Technical Specifications*, held at Witte de With in 2008, represented an implosion and explosion of his entire practice, as he simultaneously reduced his own works to the sum of their parts and opened them up to other readings, other formats, other artists and other audiences beyond the institution's walls. This eponymous book captures that process, documenting the visual appearance of the exhibition itself and the content of the radio show which was broadcast for the duration of the show, and which is

now streamed online (www.technical-specifications.net). The volume itself contains *Lyrics, Procs*, a book of aphorisms, a book which interrogates all the CDs that Afif has released to date, revealing how his earlier work informs the more recent practice, and a CD (referred to this exhibition, Daniel Baurmann and Ina Blom evoke the way to which the practice is re-forming, meaning that on numerous occasions the readers' and/or listeners' hypotheses are proven wrong, or are an acoustically flexible, fluid, and mobile work of information, a sound sculpture that emerges in the radio broadcast itself).

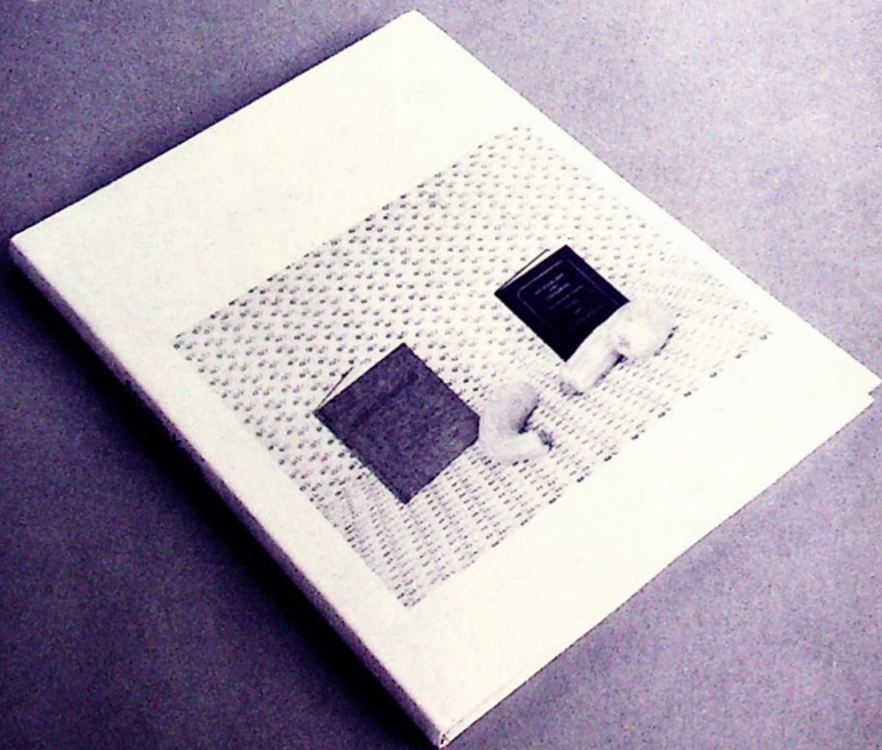

Contrary to their apparent simplicity and reduced aesthetic, Kelm's images contain a wealth of references, from interior design and architecture, to Hollywood films or current day concerns with exoticism and global trade. This monograph contains a fascinating discussion about the artist by Suzanne Pfeffer, Beatrix Ruf and Nicolai Schafhausen, as well as three newly commissioned essays: "Sense and Sensibility: Pleasure, Pattern and the Picture Plane" by Zoë Gray; "Target and Record" by Caoimhin Mac Giolla Léith; and "This is Not a Photograph" by Dirk von Lowtzow.

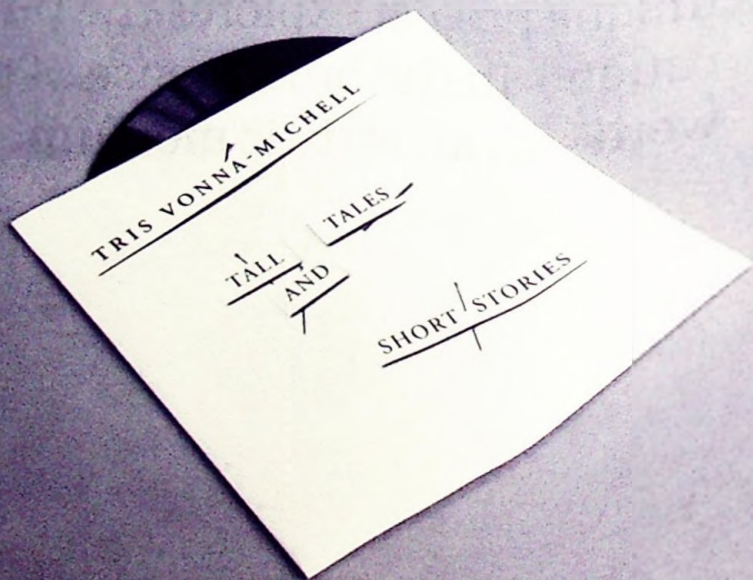

Gareth Moore (b. 1975) is an artist whose work is often situated outside the gallery or museum and involves film traveling far beyond his base in Vancouver, Canada. Part of his eponymous solo exhibition at Witte de With in the Spring of 2008, this limited edition booklet comprises a flow of wisdoms about water and its powers. The book contains segments of writings by an Austrian observer of nature, some of which were

reproduced in the Rotterdam newspaper *De Havenloods* throughout April 2008. The paper for this book was rescued from recycling by Raddraaier Printers, Amsterdam, and photocopied by Grand Prix Multicopy, Amsterdam. The cover was printed in letterpress by Will Holder at Woodside Press (Brooklyn, NY), using 18 point Monotype Fournier Italic until the type ran out of W's.

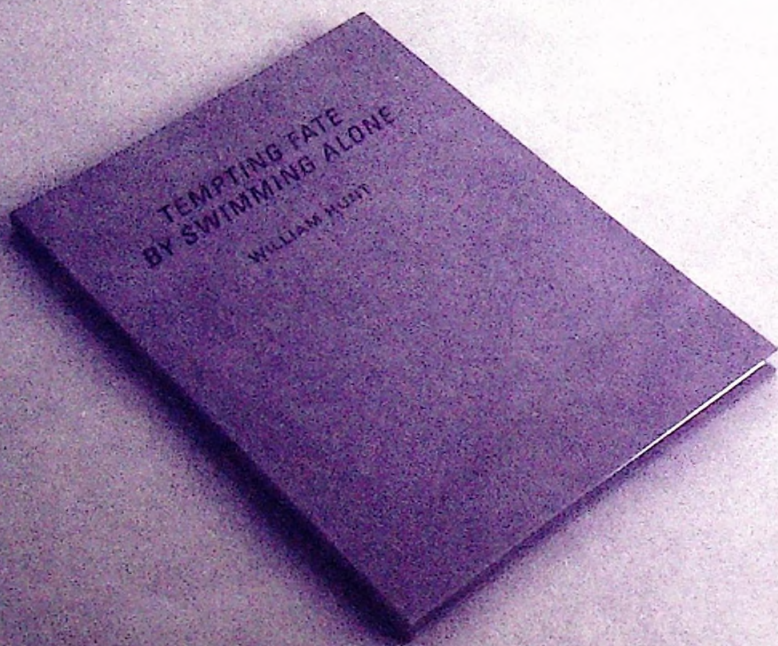

Tempting Fate by Swimming Alone / William Hunt

This first monographic publication devoted to the work of British performance artist William Hunt (b. 1977) was produced on the occasion of his eponymous solo exhibition at Witte de With in the Fall of 2008. The unusual book encapsulates the artist's singular sense of physical impracticality. A beautifully sparse red cover holds a folded paper that, on one side, reproduces a performatively made silk-screen index of the

artist's body and, on the other, production stills of said silk-screen as well as a special text contribution by critic Sally O'Reilly entitled "A Litany of Stoppages." Her inspired selection of passages from novelists, philosophers, punsters and humorists offers uncommon insight into Hunt's far-reaching, open-ended work with the romantic image and its associated performance in art and life. 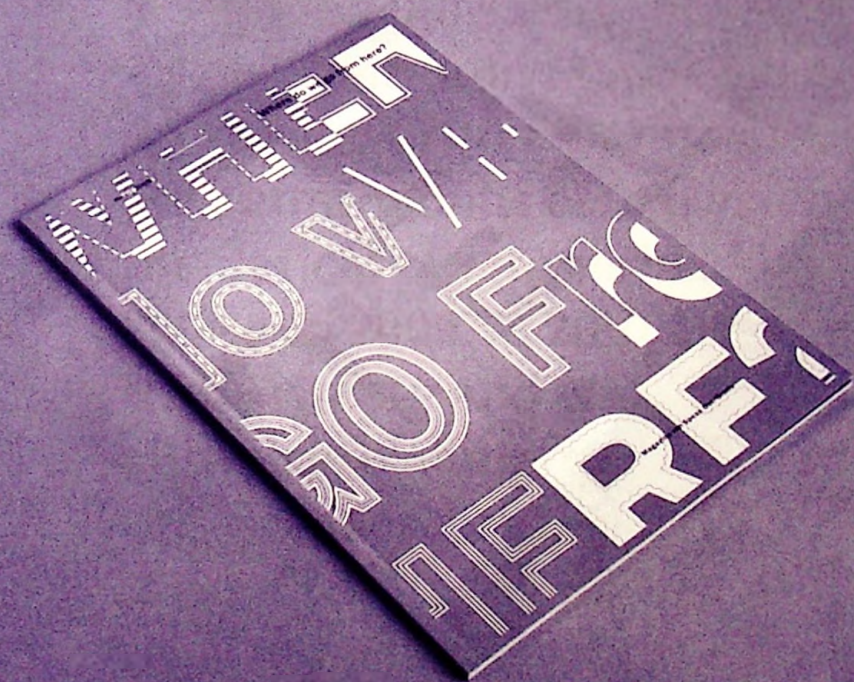
Education

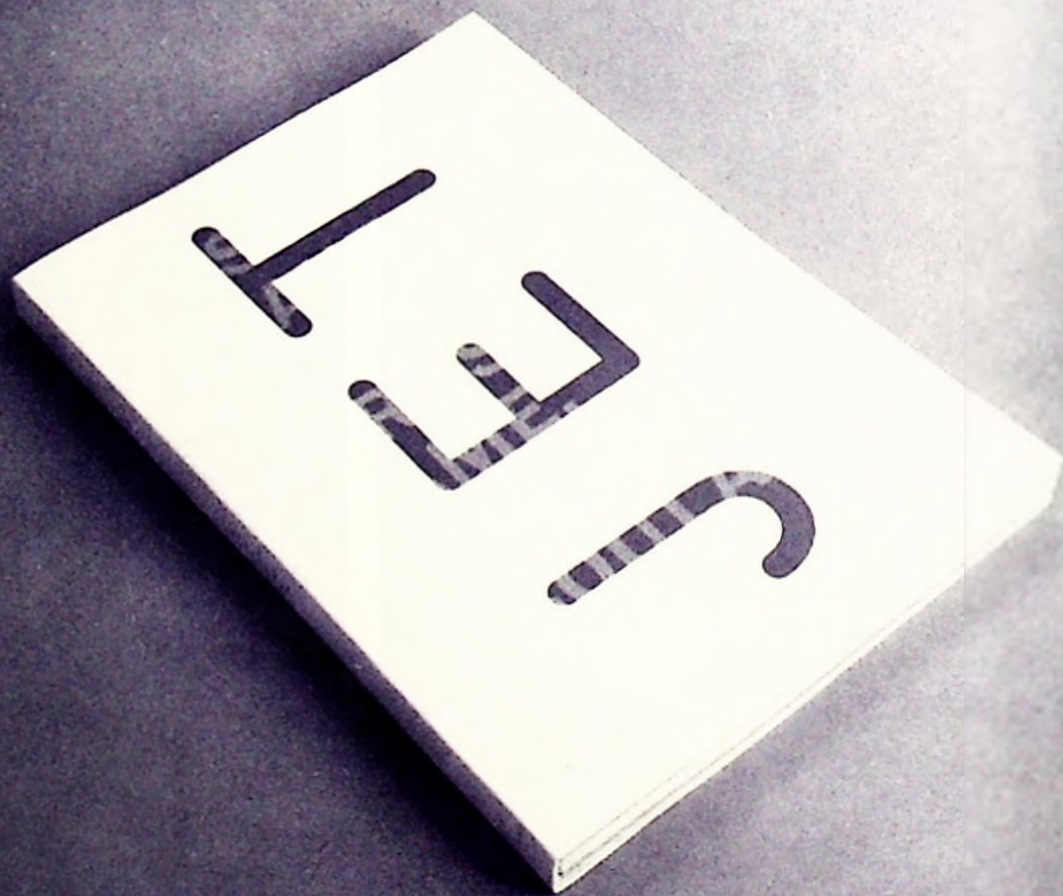

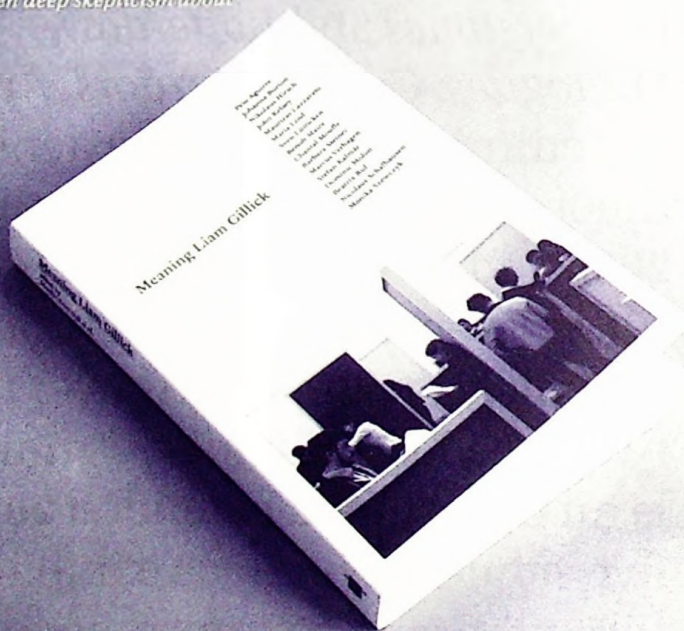
Meaning Liam Gillick

This is the first critical reader on the work of Liam Gillick (b. 1964), a New York- and London-based artist who emerged in the 1990s in the midst of paradigmatic political and cultural change. In the past two decades, Gillick has developed a highly influential artistic practice around a discursive model that complicates object production and raises key social questions: *What are the political, aesthetic and material dimensions of discourse? What is the role of design in a world shaped by speculation and haunted by planning? What is the most effective resistance to ideological hegemony? And how can historical or temporal consciousness be reformed given deep skepticism about progress?*

This reader brings together distinct voices of critics, historians, curators and artists to address Gillick's work within its contexts.

Between October 2008 and April 2009, Witte de With hosted three extraordinary three-day conferences, which took as their point of focus three protagonists of contemporary art: critics, curators and artists.
