Journeys is a video work, installed in the library, inspired by eight individuals on their travels; real and imaginary. A collaborative project, this travelogue began as a series of workshops. Working together with the artists, each participant filmed and edited their own individual journey.

Two commentaries act as guides; one signed by each participant in British Sign Language and another spoken. Journeys, the workshops' outcome, reverses the usual patterns of access that seek to include disabled people in public spaces.

Journeys is part of the North London Link Project, a series of public art works for new audiences developed by Camden Arts Centre. This exhibition coincides with the launch of Swiss Cottage Central Library's new service for the Deaf community.

Journeys is funded by the Arts Council of England Artists in Sites for Learning Fund and Camden Libraries. It is co-ordinated through the North London Link Project, Camden Arts Centre, supported by the National Lottery through the London Arts Board and the Henry Moore Foundation.

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
