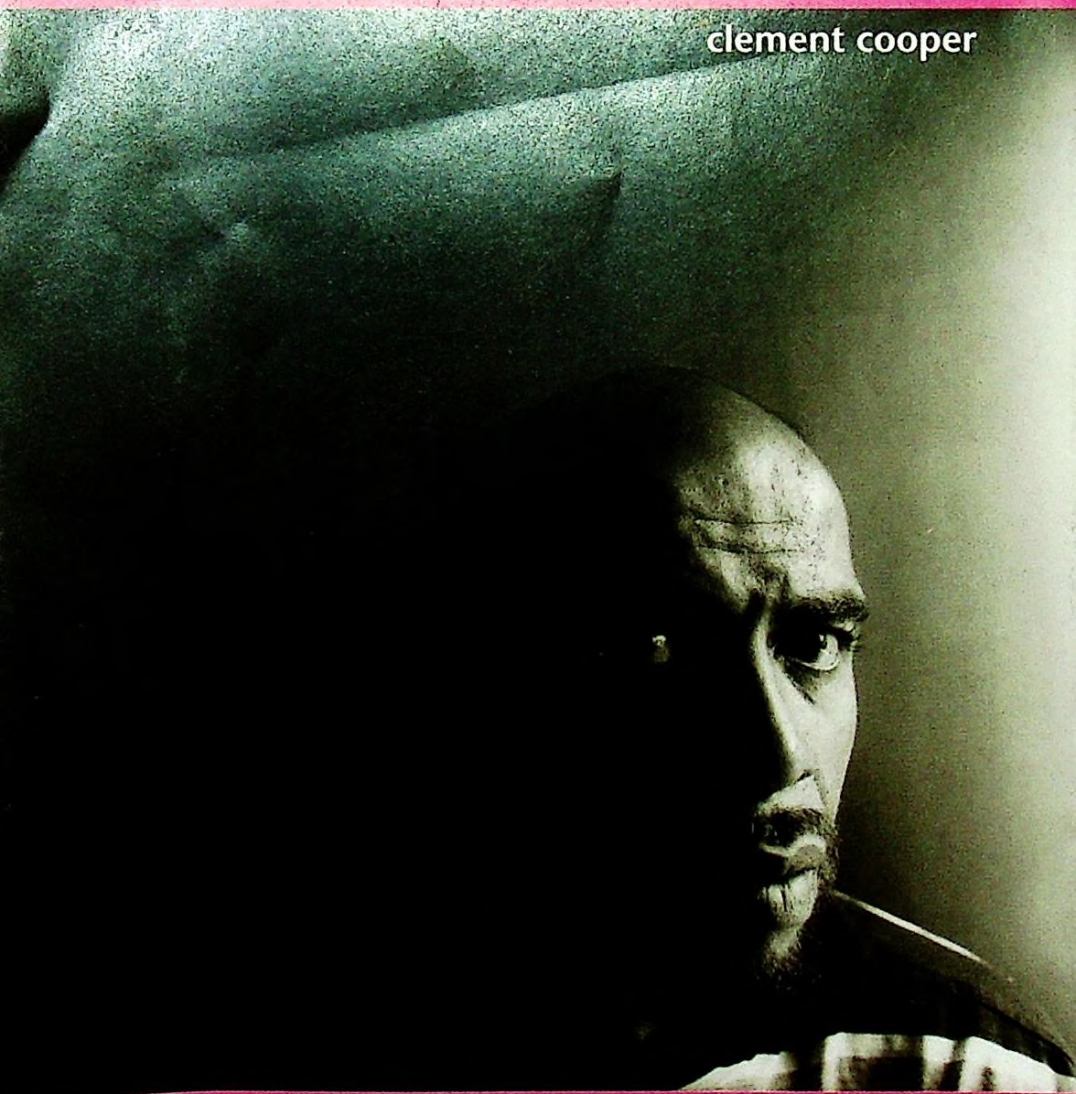

david levinthal: goleuni tywyll

14 hydref - 18 tachwedd 1995

Daeth David Levinthal i'r amlwg yn ystod y 1980au fel un o'r pwysicaf o blith artistiaid cyfoes Americanaidd sydd yn gweithio â ffotograffiaeth. Fel llawer o'i genhedlaeth, mae lluniau Levinthal yn gwrthod y syniad o ddal realaeth; yn hytrach, mae'n creu ac ail-ddyfeisio'r byd yn y stiwdio. Ffrwyth prosiect a sefydlwyd gan NACE, y Gymdeithas ar gyfer Addysg Oriolau, yw'r arddangosfa hon, fel rhan o gynllun newydd a dyfeisgar y gymdeithas, Dewis Celf, sydd yn annog pob disgybl ysgol uwchradd yn eu nawfed blwyddyn i ddewis celf yn llythrennol ar gyfer TGAU, drwy gynnig profiad uniongyrchol ysbrydoledig o gelfyddyd. Mae *Darlunio Ein Hunain* yn dwyn ynghyd ddetholiad o ddelweddau ffotograffig a gynhyrchwyd gan grwpiau o blant o Ysgol Lewis i Ferched, Morgannwg

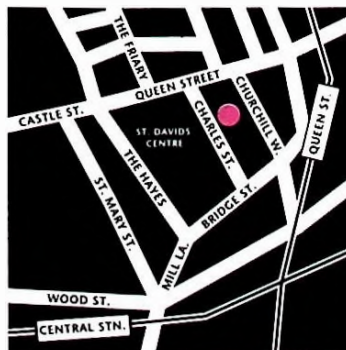

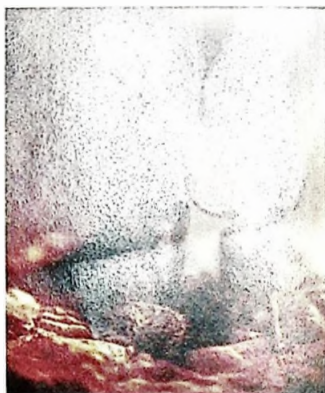

david levinthal: dark light

14 october - 18 november 1995

David Levinthal emerged during the 1980s as one of the major American contemporary artists working with photography. Like many of his generation Levinthal's pictures reject the idea of capturing reality and instead construct and re-invent the world in the studio. His photographs are vivid tableaux, in which toy figures re-enact scenes that draw heavily on Hollywood's images of mythic America. Through manipulation of light and focus, Levinthal swathes these miniature theatrical compositions in planes of colour and deep shadows that - like film - both mimic and dramatise reality. In his work the world becomes a haunting fiction combining childhood fantasies with adult nightmare. A Photographers' Gallery/London exhibition.



ffotoannual 1995

25 november - 23 december 1995

Now in its fifteenth year, this regular feature of the Ffotogallery calendar has become a useful barometer to the state of independent photography in Wales, reflecting a diversity of photographic concerns, including documentary reportage, portraiture and constructed photography. The exhibition is open to all Ffotogallery members, who are able to submit up to four works, at least one of which will be selected by a prominent figure from the artworld. This year, Colin Ford, Director of the National Museums and Galleries of Wales will act as selector for Ffotoannual 1995. Colin was formerly Keeper at the National Museum of Photography, Film and Television in Bradford and has a long and distinguished association with photography. We are grateful once again to Leeds Photovisual for their continued sponsorship of this exhibition.

picturing ourselves: school children in the frame

6 january - 3 february 1996

This exhibition is the culmination of a project established by NAGE, the National Association for Gallery Education as part of their innovative **Opt For Art** initiative which encourages all secondary school pupils at year nine stage to literally opt for art at GCSE, by offering an inspirational first hand experience of Art. *Picturing Ourselves* brings together a selection of photographic images produced by groups of children from Lewis Girls' School, Mid Glamorgan and

Cantonian High School, Cardiff. The works, studio constructions comprising of still life objects and models, look thematically at the portrait and are inspired by original paintings and sculpture from the National Museum and Galleries in Cardiff, as well as numerous examples drawn from contemporary photography. We are very grateful to Dave Daggers, the photographer who recorded the completed work in schools and presented a series of lectures on contemporary photography to over 400 school children.

art in time: seton smith

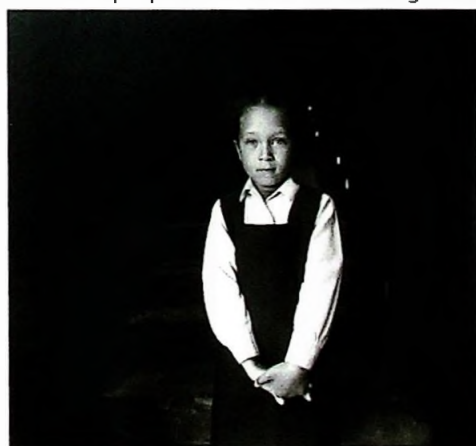
8 february - 17 february 1996

Art in Time, a short international season of multi-media art in Cardiff organised by *Grey Suit* and the *Cardiff Institute of Higher Education* comes to Ffotogallery with a presentation of the acclaimed American artist, Seton Smith, now living and working in Paris. The large photographs she presents are often related to architecture, to furniture or to nature at its most architectural. Many of these prints are out of focus or reverberate with after-image effects, creating icons which tremble and glow with half-life. Among her many exhibitions, she has shown at the Musée d'Art Moderne de la Ville de Paris and at the Neuberger Museum in New York.

clement cooper: us

24 february - 30 march 1996

The terms 'half-caste' and 'half-breed' are commonly used terms to describe people from a mixed-race background. These expressions



derive from a fear amongst both the black and white communities, that the mixing of races has a detrimental effect on cultural identity. Taking this contentious issue as his starting point, Clement Cooper a young photographer of mixed-race heritage, set out to compassionately record a number of acquaintances that he met during extensive visits to four cities in Britain during 1995,

including Liverpool, Bristol, Cardiff and his own home town of Manchester. The resulting exhibition, brings together a series of powerful portraits of Afro-Caribbean/British individuals between the ages of 5 and 30, in conjunction with a 40 minute CD soundtrack compiled by the photographer; this provides an oral history reflecting the diversity of feelings and thoughts of the photographer's subjects. The exhibition is a collaboration locally between Ffotogallery, Bute Town History & Arts Centre and Cardiff Bay Art Trust, and nationally with Open Eye Gallery/Liverpool, Viewpoint Gallery/Salford and Autograph, the Association of Black Photographers/London.

Ffotogallery is the leading gallery in Wales promoting the photographic arts. The gallery organises an on-going programme of exhibitions and educational events concentrating on contemporary practice and vanguard British and European photographic art. Many of the self-originated exhibitions tour to galleries, art centres and community venues throughout Wales, Britain and Europe. In addition, high quality publications supplementing exhibitions are produced two or three times a year. Ffotogallery is a Company Limited by Guarantee and a Registered Charity, run by a Board of Management elected by and from its membership. 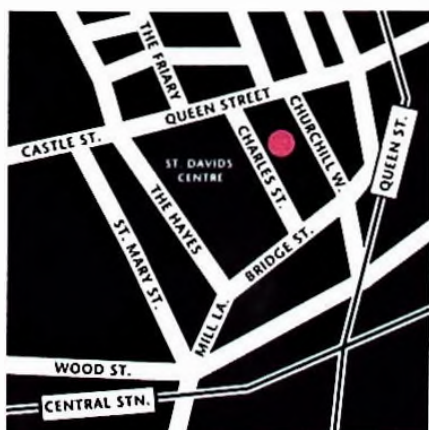
